

Be a Guardian of Democracy BE A POLL WORKER

To qualify as a poll worker in **ALABAMA**:

Must be registered to vote in Alabama, 18+ years old,

Resident of precinct, declared party affiliation, complete training. Earn \$75+

To sign up, contact local Election Board.

Approx DEADLINE to sign up to be a Poll Worker: Sep 19, 2020

How Poll Workers are chosen: No later than 45 days before election, the 2 political parties which received the highest number of votes in the state in the preceding election provide the appointing board with a list of recommended poll workers from qualified voters.

The probate judge, sheriff & clerk of the circuit court act as the appointing board for the county. 15-20 Days before an election, the appointing board uses the lists to appoint, to each voting place, 1 inspector & at least 3 clerks from members of opposing political parties.

****A county may employ electronic voting specialists as trouble shooters during election.**

Poll watcher: 1 per party per polling place. No election officials, including returning officials.

QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

***Approx DEADLINE to sign up to be a Poll Worker: Sep 19, 2020**

POLL WATCHER INFO: Poll Watchers are appointed by the chairman of the party's county executive committee, or by a nominee, or by a beat committeeman. Must be Residents of Alabama and registered to vote. The name of each poll watcher must be submitted to an inspector by the county executive committee or nominees for office.

Poll Watchers have the right to:

Observe the conduct of the election; Monitor the preliminaries of opening the polls; Remain at the polling place throughout the election until the results of the election have been posted and the voting machines sealed, as provided by law; Observe the ballots as they are counted; Observe absentee ballots and affidavits when they are called during the count; See all oaths administered and signed, the record of assisted voters, the list of qualified voters, the poll lists, and any and all records made in connection with the election. Poll watchers may not disturb voters, attempt to influence voters, campaign, or display or wear any campaign material or buttons while inside any polling place; Under no circumstances will any form of voter intimidation be tolerated. Anyone voting on Election Day that observes or is a victim of voter intimidation in their polling location should first report it at stopvoterfraudnow.com and then call (334) 242-7210.

***Who is Authorised to Challenge a Voter's Eligibility on Election Day?**

Poll Watchers are Authorised to challenge a Voter's Eligibility on Election Day: An election inspector may challenge an individual's eligibility to vote.
